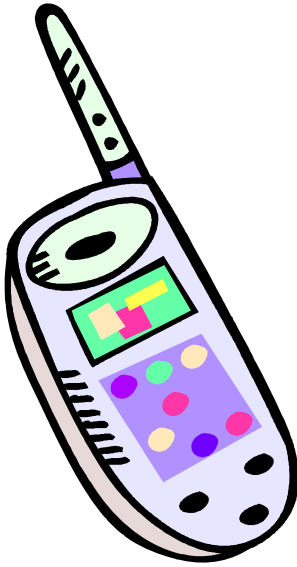


Cell Phones



- Phones must remain off and concealed during school hours, including field trips, and when students are on school buses.
- Phones may be used on campus until 8:25 a.m. and after 3:15 p.m.
- Students cannot use cell phones in the library at any time.
- Phones are to be turned **OFF** and hidden from sight in a backpack, pocket, or purse.
- If a parent needs to contact you during the school day, they may call the main school number to have a message delivered to you.
- If you need to make a call during the school day, come in to the school office and ask permission to use an office phone.
- Students requesting to use the restroom during class may not take their cell phone with them.
- Phones should be clearly marked with student's name.
- **DO NOT** take pictures with your picture phones on campus.



Consequences:

IF...

...your cell phone rings during class, it will be confiscated by the teacher and sent to the office. Your parent will need to come to the school office to retrieve the phone. Consequences begin with Lunch Detention and can escalate from there depending on repeated violations.

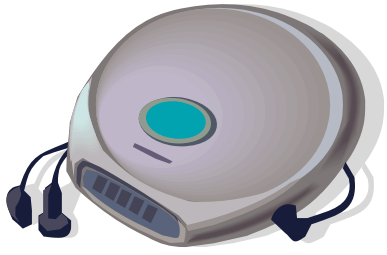
...you are found using your cell phone at any time in the library or restroom during lunch or snack, it will be confiscated and result in a disciplinary action.

- Repeated violations of phone policy may result in additional consequences.

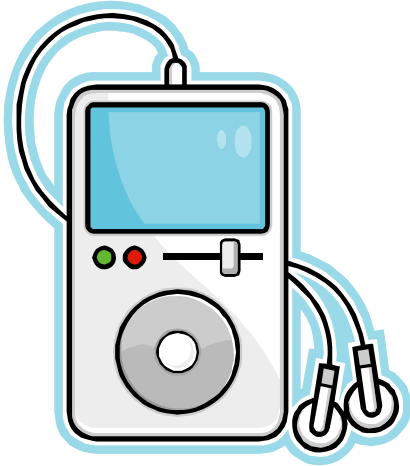

"Tunes" on Campus



iPods, MP3 players, CD players, and other listening devices are not to be used during school hours. They may be used before the first bell rings and after the final bell rings at the end of the school day.

Your device must be turned off, put away, and out of sight during the entire school day. This includes the earphones and headsets.



There is no lunch time use allowed. Use your lunch period to socialize with peers, play on the lower courts, go to the Bobcat Center for games, or the library to read and study.

Students who disobey this policy will have their device confiscated and will be assigned to lunch detention for the first offense. Additional incidences will result in increased levels of disciplinary action and a parent will need to come to school to pick up the player.

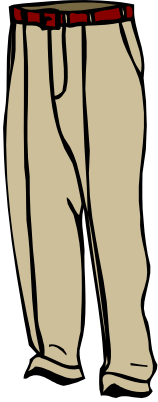
...Dress Code...



The Bobcat Dress Code is designed to encourage students to dress for the purpose of learning. Clothing should be neat, clean, free from tatters and tears, and fit properly, while following the standards of common decency and respect.



➤ School clothing, jewelry, book covers, backpacks, or binders: No sexual connotations, tobacco, alcohol, drugs, profanity, obscenity, weapons, or violence. Items that are discriminatory or demeaning toward others are prohibited. Clothing should not be altered (e.g., metal studs, patches, safety pins).



➤ No sunglasses, hats, or hoods indoors. No bandanas, do-rags, or hairnets. Extreme hairstyles, hair dyes, or make-up are not permitted - only natural human hair colors are permitted.



➤ Clothing that is revealing such as halter tops, tube tops, bathing suit tops, or tops that are strapless, see-through, low-cut or expose the midriff are not permitted. Bra straps, belly buttons, and cleavage should not be seen. Tank top shoulder straps must be 1-1/2" to 2" wide. No thin or spaghetti straps allowed. No pajama tops.

➤ Shorts, skirts, skorts, and dresses must be an appropriate length for school. **The hem bottom must meet the tips of the fingers when fingers are extended.**

➤ Long dangling belts are not permitted.



➤ Pants and shorts must be sewn to fit and be able to be worn at the waist without the need for a belt - **"Sagging" is not allowed.** Pants and shorts must be hemmed or cuffed - no torn or tattered edges. No visible underwear showing above or below pants. Shirts and pants must meet when sitting. No pajama bottoms.



➤ Footwear must not interfere with required school activities. Slippers and footwear containing wheels are not permitted.

Also: Jewelry, wallet chains over 3" long, key chains, and accessories which, in the opinion of the staff, attract undue attention or pose a threat to the safety of others are not permitted. No offensive writing on backpacks, book covers, clothes, or binders. For identification purposes, only the student's first name and last should be written on the backpack.



The administration retains the sole discretion to make the final determination whether clothing, jewelry and accessories and/or appearance meet acceptable standards.



Consequences for not following the dress code:

Students who do not comply with the Bobcat Dress Code can expect (1) to be asked to change into P.E. clothes or other available clothes located in the Health Office; (2) to have a parent called to bring other clothes; (3) to be sent home and/or assigned additional consequences for repeated behaviors.

Student Participation Guidelines

According to BHMS Guidelines for Student Participation in Extracurricular Activities, students must meet the criteria listed below, each quarter, in order to participate during the following quarter in school-sponsored activities. Please note that the first semester of the school year provides a “fresh start” for students. Eligibility does not carry over from the prior year. However, students can become ineligible at any time based on poor behavior as determined by an administrative review team comprised of an administrator, teacher(s) and the student’s counselor. These activities include, but are not limited to, dances, sports teams, concerts, grade-level special events and trips.

Students must have:

- ♦ _____ GPA of 2.0 or above
- ♦ _____ No “U’s” in CONDUCT
- ♦ _____ No SUSPENSIONS

ACADEMIC HONESTY



Site Policy requires that:

- all school work be the legitimate, truthful work of the students.
- students submit tests, essays, projects, and homework that are free from fraud or deception.
- students write their own essays and do their own homework.
- students rely on their own knowledge and preparation when taking tests. Students credit sources when using the wording, ideas, facts, statistics, or opinions of another person or book. *If the source is not given, this is defined as plagiarism.*



District Policy: The Governing Board believes that academic honesty and personal integrity are fundamental components of a student's educational experience. The Board expects that students will demonstrate acts of academic honesty at all times and will not engage in acts of:

- cheating on tests
- fabrication/falsification
- unauthorized collaboration
- plagiarism
- theft/alteration of materials or equipment



The Board intends that the District data network, Internet, and other on-line resources provided, be used to support the instructional program and further student learning. Users of the District's computing and network resources are required to use such resources responsibly, ethically, and in compliance with usage agreements outlined in District policy.

Disciplinary actions for violations of the rules of the academic honor policy may range in severity and will be appropriate to the situation. Disciplinary actions include, but are not limited to, the following:



1. No credit on assignment
2. Suspension
3. Unsatisfactory citizenship grade
4. Expulsion
5. Saturday School
6. Dropped from class

DISCIPLINARY HIERARCHY

The following chart indicates the disciplinary actions that apply to each problem area. In each instance, a minimum and maximum action is suggested. **There are also alternate actions that can be used at the discretion of the administrator.** If a student has demonstrated excellent behavior and then becomes involved in a problem, school officials may consider the record of that student's good behavior before any action is taken. Such factors as length of time since a student's last problem, his/her attitude, etc., will be taken into account for a student who is continually involved in problems.

NO HAZING: Hazing, or any form of initiation which is degrading, is strictly forbidden by California State Law. No student shall conspire to engage in hazing, participate in hazing or commit any act that causes or is likely to cause bodily danger, physical harm, or personal degradation or disgrace resulting in *physical or mental harm* to any fellow student or other person. Persons violating this policy shall be subject to District discipline, misdemeanor penalties and forfeiture of entitlements.
