

QUILTING - Beginning- Supply List

TEACHER – Susan Hopkins

The Log Cabin block is divided into two halves, a "light side" and a "dark side". For the "light side", you will need three fabrics ranging from light to medium to dark. For the "dark side", you will need three fabrics ranging from light to medium to dark. Vary your prints from small to large. You may also use a solid. Choose a border in a complementary fabric, and accent the binding to bring out a favorite fabric in the quilt. Your backing may match your quilt fabrics or you may use a fabric as a contrast.

SUPPLY LIST:

<u>Center</u>	1/8 yd.	<u>(Colors below are only suggestions):</u> Class sample - Red
<u>1 st Light</u>	1/4 yd.	Class sample - White
<u>2nd Light</u>	3/8 yd.	"
<u>3rd Light</u>	1/2 yd.	"
<u>1st Dark</u>	1/4 yd.	Class sample - Blue
<u>2nd Dark</u>	3/8 yd.	"
<u>3rd Dark</u>	1/2 yd.	"
<u>Border (4")</u>	1/2 yd.	Class sample - Blue Star Print (red would look nice also)
<u>Binding</u>	1/2 yd.	Class sample - Red
<u>Backing & Batting</u>	2 3/8 yd. - 2 1/2 yd.	

Self-healing mat (large 24" x 36", medium 18" x 24", small 11" x 17"). The medium is sufficient for this class and travels well.

- Rotary cutter (and replacement blades, although you shouldn't need a replacement blade before the end of this class).
- 100% Cotton fabric (yardage as above).
- Good quality thread (Polyester or cotton-wrapped polyester), neutral color or to match fabrics. Buy at least two spools.
- Invisible thread (can be found in the notion aisle at Joann's). It will be used to "stitch-in-the-ditch" before attaching the binding.
- Seam ripper (you will use this!)
- Long quilting pins (mine have white & yellow beaded tops).
- Quilting safety pins (to tack quilt together near completion).
- Good quality sewing scissors (keep them for cutting fabric & thread only!)
- One package of cotton or polyester batting. You may use flannel fabrics for the quilt if you'd like. When flannel is used for the quilt top and backing. I find it sufficient enough to not have to use batting. If you choose flannels, you may omit the batting.

A fee of \$1.50 will be collected on the first night of class for the use of a bobbin. The \$1.50 will be returned at the completion of this class when the bobbin is returned.
