**SECTION 3.27.10 School-Based Coordinated Programs**

In order to provide greater flexibility for schools to better coordinate the categorical funds they receive, and to focus the authority to exercise such flexibility at the school level, School Site Councils may consider participation in a School-Based Coordinated Program (SBCP), in which funds from participating programs may be used in any way to support the student achievement goals within the plan.

Specifically, the School Site Council:

1. Decides, each year, whether or not to operate a School-Based Coordinated Program
2. Decides which of the allowable funding sources it wishes to coordinate, subject to local Board approval. Programs which may be coordinated include Gifted and Talented Education, Economic Impact Aid, Special Education, and School and Library Improvement
3. Consults with the following advisory committees from included programs (if applicable):
  - a. District and School Leadership Team (if applicable – Title I schools in Program Improvement)
  - b. English Learner Advisory Committee
  - c. Gifted and Talented Education Advisory Committee
  - d. Library Planning Committee
  - e. Special Education Advisory Committee
  - f. State Compensatory Education Advisory Committee (if applicable)
  - g. Other committees established by the school or district
4. Ensures that the school plan meets the requirements of, and include the content of the Single Plan for Student Achievement (see Administrative Procedure 3.27.2)

After the School-Based Coordinated Program is approved by the School Site Council and Learning Support Services, it will be forwarded to the Board for final approval.

Approval by the Board indicates that the following occurred:

1. The Principal received and provided information regarding School-Based Programs.
2. All interested persons had the opportunity to meet to establish a council.
3. The School Site Council had the opportunity to decide whether the school would participate in a School-Based Coordinated Program.
