## WORLD LANGUAGE COURSE OFFERINGS

### SPANISH:

**Spanish 1-2:** This is an introductory language course, covering the basics of the present (indicative) tense, vocabulary structures including clothing, families, school and pastimes. Spanish speaking cultures and literacy in Spanish is introduced. The course focus is on writing and literacy as a means for language acquisition. This course is ideal for students who are new to foreign language instruction, or who would like to fine-tune their skills by retaking their middle school course.

**Spanish 3-4:** The second level in Spanish (as a foreign language) instruction, this course continues the present tense including the present subjunctive. The course ends with the basics of the two past tenses in Spanish. Vocabulary structures and cultural awareness are continued in this course. This course is intended for students who were successful in Spanish 1-2, earning a grade of C or better.

**Spanish 5-6, Spanish 7-8, and Honors Spanish 9-10 / AP Spanish are also offered.**

\*\* Spanish 5-6 can be considered by native speakers who would like to develop their writing skills.

## **FRENCH:**

**French 1-2:** This is an introductory language course, covering the basics of the present (indicative) tense, begins the past tense, and explores vocabulary structures including clothing, families, school and pastimes. French speaking cultures and literacy in French is introduced. This course is ideal for students who are new to foreign language instruction, or who would like to fine-tune their skills by retaking their middle school course.

**French 3-4:** The second level in French (as a foreign language) instruction, this course continues the present tense including the present subjunctive. The course ends with the basics of the two past tenses in French. Vocabulary structures and cultural awareness are continued in this course. This course is intended for students who were successful in French 1-2, earning a grade of C or better.

**French 5-6 and AP French** are also offered.

\*\* French 5-6 can be considered by native speakers who would like to develop their writing skills.

## **FILIPINO:**

**Filipino 1-2:** Filipino 1-2 introduces students to the Filipino language. This course will allow students to develop the skills required to conduct basic conversations. Students will learn common greetings, linking words, nouns, verbs, pronouns, adverbs, adjectives, basic sentence structure, and vocabulary through thematic units. Culture and history are integrated into the lessons.

**Filipino 3-4:** The second level in Filipino enhances the four communication skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing learned from Filipino 1-2. Students will increase their vocabulary, enhance their grammatical skills, and use them progressively in more complex structures. Culture and history are integrated into the lessons. This course is intended for students who were successful in Filipino 1-2, earning a C or better. This is an appropriate consideration for native speakers of Filipino; however, native speakers are encouraged to complete Filipino 1-2.

**Filipino 5-6 and Filipino 7-8** are also offered.
