For the 2017-18 school year, the six student representatives will alternate months, with three attending each board meeting. This month we heard reports from Abraxas High, Del Norte High, and Mt. Carmel High. The students from Poway High, Rancho Bernardo High, and Westview High will give their next reports at the December 14th meeting.

- Alec Cito (Abraxas) Introduced himself as a student in the Transition Program, learning important life skills and working at job sites, including Home Goods, Walgreens, Salvation Army, and Armstrong Garden, many students participated in Jack-O-Smash (Transition Program is a beneficiary of Jack-O-Smash); the leadership class hosted its second blood drive, will perform holiday concert at senior apartments, garden has produced 2,500 pounds of food to Friends and Family Community Connections, November 16th dedication of fruit tree orchard
- **Jordan Dixon** (Del Norte) College representatives have been visiting campus and seniors working hard on applications, 7 scholar-athletes participated in signing day, students are studying hard for finals next week; new classrooms being built at back of school, DECA attended career development conference, cyber security placed first in nationals, and ASB students attended No Place for Hate conference, Red Ribbon Week, Food Drive, performing arts putting on many successful productions, recognized students as Faces of the Flock instead of traditional homecoming court
- Alliyah Gardea (Mt. Carmel) Mt. Carmel hosted all-inclusive homecoming, with highest attendance in last ten years, senior night wrapping up fall sports, hosted over 40 bands at band tournament, Importance of Being Earnest play, Keith Hawkins returned for underclassmen retreat

Note: The selected Map will be used only for next two elections: 2018 and 2020, then redrawn after 2020 census

- -17 additional maps were submitted since last hearing on October 12th
- -148 public comments emails received regarding maps
- -Criteria to consider: Federal Laws: Equal population, Federal Voting Rights Act, No Racial Gerrymandering and Traditional Criteria: Communities of interest, compact and contiguous, visible boundaries, respect for voters' wishes and continuity
- -CA law limits PUSD to elections at large, from area, or by area. Only by-district elections protect the District from a California Voting Rights Act lawsuit
