

DISCIPLINE FOR USE OR POSSESSION OR SALE OF ALCOHOL AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

Students of the district will be disciplined in accordance with statutes of the State of California. A student will be subject to disciplinary action for the designated acts if the act is related to school activity or attendance and which occurs at any time within the school district or any other school district, including, but not limited to, any of the following:

1. The student is on school grounds.
2. The student is going to or coming from school.
3. The student is on break or lunch period, whether on or off campus.
4. The student is going to, coming from, or attending a school-sponsored activity.

Prohibited Acts

1. Unlawfully possessing, using, having consumed, or being under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, dangerous drugs, unauthorized prescription medications (e.g., OxyContin, Soma, Ritalin), other controlled substances, synthetic drugs (e.g., spice, K2, bath salts, etc.), or intoxicants of any kind, including over-the-counter medications which create an intoxicating effect.

a. Disciplinary Action

(1) First Offense

6-12

Suspend and recommend expulsion, or suspend and transfer to another middle school or high school or the continuation high school, for the remainder of the semester and following semester. Initiate an intervention contract.

K-5

Suspend five (5) school days. Initiate an intervention contract.

(2) Second Offense

6-12

Suspend and recommend for expulsion.

DISCIPLINE FOR USE OR POSSESSION OR SALE OF ALCOHOL AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES (continued)

K-5

Suspend and recommend for expulsion.

2. Unlawfully possessing, offering, arranging, or negotiating to sell any drug paraphernalia as defined in Section 11014.5 of the Health and Safety Code.

- (1) First Offense

6-12

Suspend or suspend and transfer to another middle school, high school, or the continuation high school for the remainder of the semester and the following semester. Initiate an intervention contract.

K-5

Suspend five (5) school days. Initiate an intervention contract.

- (2) Second Offense

6-12

Suspend and recommend for expulsion.

K-5

Suspend and recommend for expulsion.

3. Transferring, selling, distributing, offering, arranging, or negotiating to sell, or to give, or sell to other students substances which are or are purported to be alcohol, narcotics, dangerous drugs, unauthorized prescription medications (e.g., OxyContin, Soma, Ritalin), other controlled substances, synthetic drugs (e.g., spice, K2, bath salts, etc.), or intoxicants of any kind, including over-the-counter medications which create an intoxicating effect.

- (1) First Offense

6-12

Suspended and recommended for expulsion. Contact law enforcement.

DISCIPLINE FOR USE OR POSSESSION OR SALE OF ALCOHOL AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES (continued)

K-5

Suspend five (5) school days and recommend for expulsion. Contact law enforcement.

(2) Second Offense

K-5

Suspend and recommend for expulsion.

When a period of transfer extends from the eighth grade into the ninth grade, the transfer will extend and the student will be required to attend a high school other than his/her high school of residence.

Possession of 28.5 grams or less of marijuana, other than concentrated cannabis, on the grounds of a public school by a person under the age of 18 during the hours in which school is open for classes or school related programs for student K-12 is a misdemeanor. Minors may be punished on first offense by a fine of up to \$250. The second offense may be punished by a fine of up to \$500 and/or 10 days imprisonment.

Students who have successfully completed the term of involuntary transfer and are eligible to re-enroll in the school of origin may request an intradistrict transfer pursuant to district Administrative Regulation 5116.1 to remain at the school in which he or she has been transferred. Students wishing to remain enrolled in the school to which they have been transferred shall complete district Form PP-126) within 10 school days of receiving notice from the principal, or designee, that the student is eligible to re-enroll in the school of origin pursuant to Administrative Regulation 5144.112, Involuntary Transfers to Continuation Schools.
