

## Acrylic Painting

Winter I 2022 Supply List

**Instructor:** Naomi Lesberg

This is a beginning class, so if you're not sure about paints and brushes, please wait for the first class or send me a note. There will be some materials in class you can use to get started.

If you are a continuing student, you already know what you need. Please bring what you're working on.

Masks are required in the classroom.

**Paints:** For day one, please bring a **red**, a **yellow**, and a **blue** that you like and one **brown**, such as burnt sienna, burnt umber, quinacridone burnt orange, etc. Also bring white paint or white gesso. Later, you might want to buy others. If possible, don't buy Michaels Artist's Loft Level I student grade or craft paint, but if that's what you have, it will work.

**Brushes:** A selection of synthetic brushes. Try the ones in class first if you don't have any.

**Palette:** A disposable paper palette or coated paper plates or any similar non-porous flat surface on which to place and mix your paint. Plastic cottage cheese lids are great.

**Supports:** 2-3 sheets of 8" x 10" or larger watercolor or mixed media paper for class exercises. Later you might want some stretched canvas or canvas boards (canvas panels), but it's best to buy these *after* you choose a composition.

### Miscellaneous:

Roll of paper towels.

Small spray bottle for water.

Apron, smock, or wear "dress for mess" clothes.

*Optional:* A watercolor (water-soluble) pencil and acrylic mediums (e.g. Acrylic Glazing Liquid or glazing medium or gloss or matte medium).

*Optional:* Small bottle of rubbing alcohol for cleaning up spills or mistakes.

*Optional:* An inexpensive table or floor model easel or some way to tilt your painting if you don't want to work flat.

*Optional:* Another hair dryer. There is one in the room.

**Where to buy supplies?** Artist & Craftsman Supply (Hillcrest), Dick Blick (Little Italy, San Diego State), Walmart, Michaels, and Joann Fabric & Craft. (Note: Michaels and Joann honor each other's coupons.) There are many online sources, too, such as Cheap Joe's, Jerry's Artarama, and, of course, Amazon.
