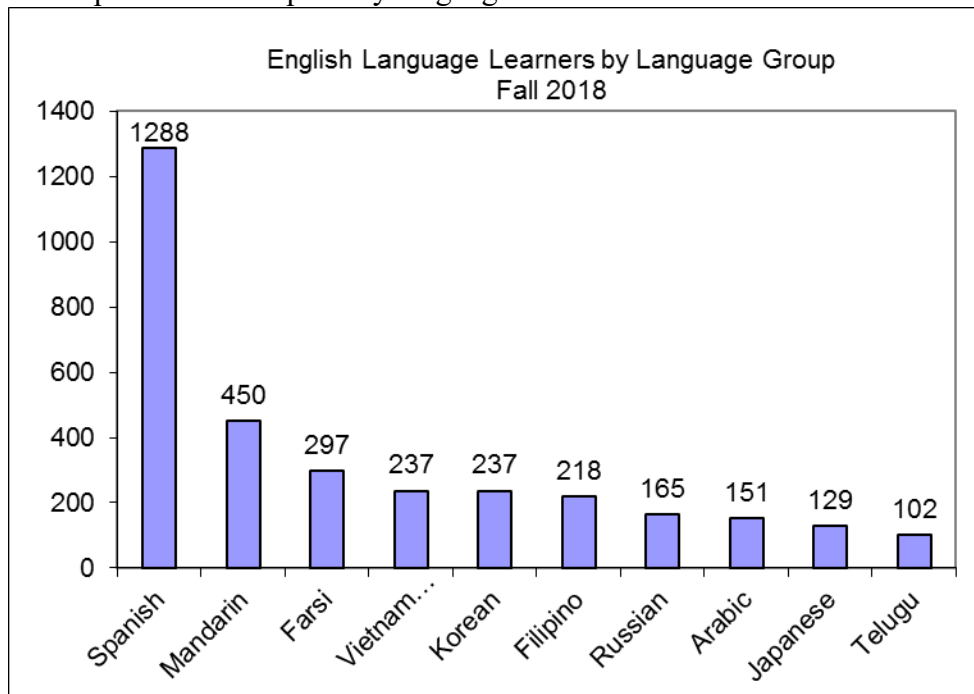
WHAT IS THE ENGLISH LEARNER PROGRAM?

The English Learner (EL) Program includes all services provided for students who have a language other than English in their home and need extra assistance to develop English skills and meet grade level content standards. Instruction at most sites is provided in English only, with some occasional support in the primary language for some of our beginning level students. The goal of the program is to help EL students develop social and academic English and to assist them in meeting the State academic content standards. EL identified students continue to receive appropriate program services until they are able to meet the district criteria for reclassification to fluent English status, based on assessment results and input from teachers and parents.

In addition to our English language development programs at each school, we also have dual immersion programs in Spanish at Valley Elementary School, and in Mandarin at Adobe Bluffs Elementary School. In the dual immersion programs, instruction is provided in both English and Spanish or English and Mandarin. Meadowbrook Middle School also offers a social studies class which is taught in Spanish. The goal of these programs is for all of the students to develop academic literacy and content area knowledge in both English and Spanish.

WHO ARE OUR ENGLISH LEARNERS?

We have EL students at every grade level at every school. Our students speak 106 different languages. Approximately 32% of our English learners have Spanish as their primary language.



As of October 1, 2018, 11% of PUSD students are identified as English Learners. In addition, 19% of our students have been determined to be Fluent English Proficient (FEP). FEP students have a language other than English in their home, but also have adequate English language skills and do not participate in the ELL program.
