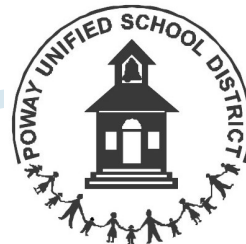

Alternative Programs - Youth in Transition

The Youth in Transition Program is part of Poway Unified School District's Alternative Programs. We

are here to help children and youth in transition.



There are many other organizations we use to refer you and your children to for help.

We can offer:

- Assistance with school placement.
- Assistance with transportation to the school of record.
- Assistance with school meals.
- Assistance with school clothes.
- Assistance with school supplies.
- Assistance with academic studies.
- Counseling services through partnerships with other PUSD departments.

Who are Children and Youth in Transition?

- Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, including children who are: sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations; living in emergency or transitional shelters; abandoned in hospitals; awaiting foster care placement.



- Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or



- similar settings.
- Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.
- Other unaccompanied youth including a youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian, which include runaways, children and youth denied housing by their families, school-aged unwed mothers living in homes for unwed mothers, etc.
