

MCHS Athletics Fan Advisory

Please be advised that the PUSD School Board, in accordance to CDPH Guidelines for Schools, has adopted policy that provides an opportunity for a limited number of household members to attend sporting events in which their child is participating. We will implement the following protocols in an attempt to limit or contain the transmission of COVID-19 so that we may continue to offer athletic opportunities for our students, as well as the opportunity for family members to attend these games. Below are the guidelines:

OUTDOOR events: Each student participant may have up to four (4) household members attend a game, including minor siblings, as long as one adult is in attendance. Any minors attending must arrive with the adult household member.

*****Special Note for Swimming Pool:** At this time, because of the limited space on the pool deck, there are no observers allowed on the pool deck.

INDOOR events: Each student participant may have up to two (2) household members attend a game, including minor siblings, as long as one adult is in attendance. Any minors attending must arrive with the adult household member.

Due to capacity limits, venues that will have multiple games (i.e. Junior Varsity game then Varsity game) may require that the venue be cleared of observers before the next game. This is highly likely for games in the gym as we anticipate reaching capacity (using proper spacing). Observers for the second game will be asked to wait outside until the gym is cleared before being admitted.

While attending any athletic event, masks are required. Masks must be worn properly at all times and households must remain at a 6ft distance from observers from other households.

If you have any symptoms of being ill, have been asked to quarantine, or have any other reason to believe that you may have or been exposed to COVID-19, please do not attend the event.

There is no snack bar service at any event and there is no charge for attending events at PUSD schools (we believe this is true across most districts, but their policies may change without notice).

We hope that you can follow these basic safety measures so that our students may continue to compete and so that our families may continue to support, cheer, and enjoy the game!
