

## 10 Things to Do on a College Campus Visit

	What to Do	Why
1	Make an appointment with an admissions representative	Campuses record who visits. Let them know who you are and that you're interested!
2	Carefully prepare a list of questions to ask the admissions rep. Ask questions that are not routinely covered on the website.	No better time than RIGHT NOW to find out this information from a human being (rather than a book or website)
3	Take a campus and dorm tour.	Can you walk the walk from dorm to class? Can you live in the provided setting?
4	Bring your list of what is important to you in regards to the physical campus, academics, social and spiritual environment	Take notes while on campus so you can easily compare schools when making your choices to apply.
5	Meet with a representative from the department you are considering for a major.	Get "insider" details about the major you are considering and ask if there are special programs or funds available for eligible incoming freshmen in that major.
6	Eat a meal on campus.	The real scoop: see where and what students eat and what they talk about.
7	Sit in on a Freshman general ed. class if possible.	See the style and structure first hand.
8	Visit the financial aid department and speak to the department head if possible.	Discover what may be available for YOU (specifically) as far as campus financial aid, how and when to apply, dates for institutional scholarships etc.
9	Stay in a hotel near the campus and tour the surrounding community.	See what resources are available (shopping, hospital, future housing, entertainment, etc.). Does it feel safe?
10	Collect local community and campus newspapers and magazines.	Gives you the pulse of the campus and community.
