

ARTS MEDIA ENTERTAINMENT PATHWAY: PHOTOGRAPHY

Year	Recommended Pathway Electives	Palomar Community College Articulation
Year 1	<p>Photography 1-2*</p> <p>Students learn the elements and principles of art through photography. Students learn the technical functions of the camera and how to adjust settings for light and speed. Students learn the basic tools to manipulate images on Adobe Photoshop and Lightroom. Students learn how to craft artist's statements and express artistic creativity in their work. This course has been approved to meet the UC/CSU "F" or "G" requirement.</p>	Photography 1-2 is articulated with Palomar Community College PHOT 120 Digital Photography I for 3 college units. Students must earn a grade of B or better in the course to earn the college credit through Palomar.
Year 2 option	<p>Photography 3-4*</p> <p>Photography 3-4 emphasizes applications of photography; for example, journalism, magazine articles, offset printing (textbook), electronic schematics, and portraiture. This course provides the opportunity for students to explore creative and career opportunities within many different areas associated with Photography. This course has been approved to meet the UC/CSU "F" or "G" requirement.</p>	
Year 2, Year 3 or Year 4 option	<p>AP Studio Art 2D Design 1-2 & Studio Art (capstone)</p> <p>Students prepare portfolio of breadth and depth of photography art work for transferrable college credit through Collegeboard; year-long process over 3 trimesters. These courses have been approved to meet the UC/CSU "F" or "G" requirement.</p>	
Year 4 option	<p>Internship* (optional capstone)</p> <p>Internship is an opportunity for students to explore a career based upon their interests, skills and abilities. Students will meet once per week with the MCHS Internship Coordinator during 5th period. The other 4 school days students will be able to leave campus early (at the end of 4th period) to attend to internship work. Students work a minimum of 5 hours per week on the job during the trimester; work hours are arranged by student and the student's professional mentor.</p>	Internship is at no financial cost and is articulated with Palomar College course CE 100 Cooperative Education for 3 college units. Students must earn a B or better in the course to earn the college credit through Palomar.
