How Should the Eligibility Process Work?

Grades 9 and 10

- Student takes academic college prep courses, preferably one in each of the following areas: English, math, science, social science (in 10th grade) and foreign language. The student should compare course selection against the list of NCAA approved core courses

Grade 11

- Student continues to take college prep courses in the areas listed above.
- Student registers for the SAT and/or ACT, making sure to use code 9999 at the time of registration. Using code 9999 will ensure the score is reported directly to the Eligibility Center.
- Student registers with the NCAA Eligibility Center and completes both the academic information and the amateurism questionnaire.
- At the end of the student's sixth semester (summer after 11th grade), the student will request that a transcript be sent to the Eligibility Center by using Docufide. ***must send a transcript from each school attended during high school***

Grade 12

- Student continues to take college prep courses in English, math, science, social studies and /or foreign language
- Student registers for additional SAT/ACT tests if necessary
- On or after April 1 of the senior year, the student goes back into their Eligibility Center account to update their academic and amateurism information and request final amateurism certification.
- After graduation, the student will request a FINAL transcript be sent to the Eligibility Center through Docufide.

~Remember that fine arts, practical arts, PE, OA/TA, and ASB are not considered CORE courses and can't be counted in your 16/14 Core Courses.
