<b>HISTORY</b>	Broncos complete 3 years starting in grade 10 (World, US, Civics/Economics).
<b>ENGLISH</b>	Take an English course each year.
<b>MATH</b>	Broncos take math all 4 years to include at least Integrated-3.
<b>SCIENCE</b>	Take at least 3 years, making sure to include 1 Biological, and 1 Physical Science.
<b>WORLD LANG.</b>	Take at least 2 classes in the same language.
<b>VISUAL &amp; PERFORM ARTS</b>	Take at least 1 year of the same area of study.
<b>HEALTH</b>	Broncos are mindful to challenge themselves with a healthy schedule that allows for good sleep daily. They take 2 years of PE a Health class to keep their mind & body strong.
<b>CTE (Career Tech. Ed)</b>	Broncos often explore at least 2 classes in a career pathway for advanced certificates and learning.

- **Connect with Career Cruising** Complete the Matchmaker grade level activity to begin your career search linking interests with potential career choices.
- **CRF meeting with your counselor**  
**Review 4-year plan** Meeting will take place in the Bronco Center during 2<sup>nd</sup> period classes in March and April.

## GRADE 10

- **Take the PSAT test**  
Access College Board resources and scores for valuable information on academics and future career options.
- **Career Cruising**  
Complete the Career Selector and discuss your career results with parents.
- **Attend 10<sup>th</sup> grade College Night**
- **Prepare for the CRF meeting**  
Meeting will take place in the Bronco Center during 2<sup>nd</sup> period classes in March and April. Review the 4-year plan.
- **Pass ALL classes**

## GRADE 11

- **Register for the PSAT**  
This year students are eligible for National Merit Scholarship consideration.
- **Register for the SAT/ACT**  
Plan to take these exams the second term of your Junior year.
- **Attend 11<sup>th</sup> grade College Night**  
Key information will be presented to RB families.
- **Take the SBAC**
- **Athletes Attend NCAA Night**
- **ASVAB**  
Open to all students. Take this exam for detailed career exploration information.
- **Continue the College Search**  
Complete the grade level Career Cruising assignment connecting future careers to potential colleges and universities.
- **Yearly CRF meeting**  
Prepare to meet with your counselor. Review 4-year plan.
- **Scholarships**  
Connect regularly to investigate options with scholarships through Career Cruising.
- **RB College Readiness Calendar**  
Print and follow the steps.
- **Pass ALL classes**

## GRADE 12

- **Attend senior meetings** Meetings take place in the fall on late start mornings.
- **RB College Readiness Calendar** Print calendar and follow the steps.
- **Retake SAT/ACT** College applications can include test scores from exams taken August through December.
- **Attend Financial Aid Night** Any student planning to attend college should be in attendance at this event.
- **Athletes Attend NCAA Night**
- **FAFSA** Submission available starting October 1 of your senior year.
- **ASVAB** Early November test open to all students. Take this exam for detailed career exploration information. Mandatory military test.
- **Attend Community College Night** If Community College is in your plans for next year please plan to attend this event.
- **Community College information meeting** Early February for interested students to connect with Palomar faculty.
- **May 1 = Decision time!** Submit a deposit to hold enrollment.
- **Finish the year on a strong note** Many students lose focus and concentration at the end of senior year. Spring grades do count!
