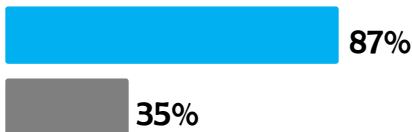

What is AVID? AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination and is a four-year, college preparatory program. It is an elective class during the regular school day that provides academic instruction and prepares students to be successful in high school and helps ensure eligibility to a 4-year university. Enrollment in this program is limited and to be considered, students must fill out the attached application and submit a photo.

Does the AVID Elective work?

87% percent of AVID students attend a four-year university; whereas the statewide university rate of 35%!
