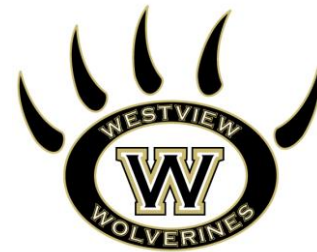

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## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

ASB is a planning and leadership class in which students experience and gain skills in leadership, parliamentary procedures, group processes, event planning, organization, goal setting, communication strategies, community service, and school-wide involvement through the planning of events and activities on campus. ASB oversees school clubs, budgets, staff and student recognition, publicity, public relations, student store, fundraising, dances, pep rallies, spirit days, cultural events, elections, and all class councils. The students are placed in period 1 ASB by teacher approval based upon the ASB election process. Applications are available in November for the ASB term that lasts from semester 2 through semester 1 of the following year.

## **COURSE EXPECTATIONS**

- Students will cultivate responsibility, initiative, creativity, and personal leadership skills while nurturing and promoting school culture and pride.
- Students will aid in the internal administration of the school through management of the student co-curricular activities.
- Students will foster positive student-faculty relationships.
- Students are expected to be role models of good citizenship and service.
- Students will become proficient at planning, organizing, executing and evaluating a variety of co-curricular student activities.
- Students will establish and carry out goals and objectives for the student government of the school.
- Students will develop valuable personal and interpersonal skills such as time management, cooperation, teamwork, responsibility, initiative and more.
