Second Grade Supply List

- 2 skinny highlighters (**yellow** + color of choice)
- 3 pads of sticky notes (any color)
- 2-3 colored pens (red, blue, and/or green)
- 1 Standard Sized Pencil Box - 8-3/8 in. L x 5-5/8 in. W x 2-1/2 in.
- 1 individual Spiral notebook (70 sheets, Wide Ruled)
- Labeled: Writing Journal
- 3 composition books (wide ruled)
- Labeled: English Language Arts Notes, Science Notes, Math Notes
- 1 set of earbuds/headphones, (labeled with name)
- 1 pair of scissors
- Personal whiteboard

4th Grade Supply List

Items for individuals:

- 1 box of 12 #2 Pencils (No Mechanical pencils)
 - 1 large eraser
 - 4 highlighters, variety of colors if possible
 - 2 glue sticks
 - 1 pair of scissors
 - 1 box thin line washable markers
 - 1 box broad line washable markers
 - 1 box colored pencils
 - 1 ballpoint pen
 - 3 chisel point Expo Dry Erase Markers (blue, black or red)
 - 3 fine point Expo Dry Erase Markers (blue, black or red)
 - 1 Expo eraser
 - 2 spiral notebooks, wide ruled, single subject
 - 2 Sharpies- fine point permanent (black)
 - 1 standard function calculator (simple)
 - 1 protractor
 - 1 ruler with inches and centimeters
 - 1 regular pocket folder
 - 1 composition book, wide ruled
 - 1 set Index cards, any size
 - 1 set of headphones or earbuds
 - 1 external mouse, if possible
- Items for when we return to the classroom:
- 1 3-ring 1 ½" binder with metal rings (round rings work best)

5th Grade Virtual Learning Supply List

- A way to scan (a phone/tablet/printer) to a PDF
- A printer (black and white is fine)
- A digital timer with clock to keep near the computer
- A place for keeping school books, notebooks and supplies organized and accessible. (a plastic bin or tray for example)

Supplies for completing work at home and when school opens:

- 4 wide ruled composition books *please stay away from spirals
- Colored pencils and small sharpener
- #2 pencils/mechanical pencils
- Erasers

- Ruler
- Dry erase markers
- A dry erase eraser (Magic Erasers and socks work well too)
- Markers

- A small pencil box for keeping supplies organized
